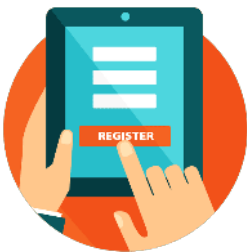


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From the Office

Kindergarten Registrations



If you have a child turning five in 2026, please register them for Kindergarten at the Board Office as soon as possible. The school District is now into the Priority 2 Round of Registration. Students registered in the Priority 2 Round are accepted to their neighborhood school only after Priority 1 Round students have been accepted and if there is space in the school. If you know someone living in the Kingswood catchment with a Kindergarten aged child, please encourage them to register now.

School Transfer Application from February 9th to February 27th

The School Transfer Round 1 opens on Monday February 9th, 2026. If you plan to register your child at a school that is not your neighborhood catchment school, you must do so from February 9th to February 27th for the best chance of getting into that school. Registering for a transfer during this time period does not guarantee you a spot. Decisions on acceptance to a school as a transfer applicant are based upon a variety of factors, including reason for a transfer and available space in that school. For students moving from Grade 7 to 8 and wishing for a transfer to a non-catchment high school, this is the period of time for your best chance of being successful for transfer approval. Decisions on Transfer Applications will be made by Friday March 13th, 2026.



Please remember to drive slowly when you are near the school and watch for children walking and crossing the street.

Student Absences

If your child will be absent from school, please call the Kingswood Early Warning Line at 604-668-6220 to leave a message. Please do not rely only on an email to your child's classroom teacher telling them about your child's absence. Classroom teachers may not have the chance to access their email before school and may mark your child as absent with an unknown reason as to why they are missing from school. If classroom teachers enter a child as absent without a reason, our office staff will make a phone call home to parents to find out the whereabouts of a child. This procedure can be aggravating for parents and takes valuable time from our office staff that could be better used.

Being on Time for School Shows Caring for your Classmates and Teacher!



Arriving at School on Time – an important life skill!

Unfortunately, there are some Kingswood students that regularly arrive late in the mornings.

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT.....

- When your child is just **5 minutes late every day** for the start of his/her class this equates to:
= five min/day or 25 min/week
 - Which would = 100 min/month
 - and = 1000 min/school year
 - that in total is = to **3 1/2 school days missed/year for being 5 minutes late each day!**
- Disruption to the rest of the class for the time it takes while your child gets settled and caught up:
= 15 min/day = 75 min/week = 300 min/month = 3,000 min/year
that is total is = to **9 1/2 school days interrupted in a year!**

If your child is 'missing' and not just late, we would want all of our time concentrated on finding your child. If there is a child who is habitually late, the focus and energy of our staff is diluted because we must now try to locate two students instead of one.

Please be considerate of others and ensure that your child is not late for school without a good reason. The warning bell rings at 8:40 a.m. and students should plan to arrive at school no later than 8:40 a.m.

Flu and Cold Season Continues



Staff and students are being reminded to assess if they are feeling well each morning before coming to school. If a student or staff member is not feeling well, they should stay home so they get better and they do not make others sick at school. Please do not send your child to school if they are feeling unwell.

The Winter months always have the highest number of student and staff absences, primarily due to illness. We can work together to minimize the number of students and staff who are ill if we all stay home when we are not feeling well.

Thank-you for your help to keep everyone at Kingswood Elementary healthy through the Winter months.



DRESS FOR THE WEATHER:

It is important that students are dressed for the weather. During these colder damp days, students need to have a warm jacket, proper footwear for the weather, a hat and perhaps gloves. If they dress appropriately for the weather, they can enjoy playing outside. We will continue as a school to go outside on days that include rain and snow.



SNOW DAYS - WHAT TO EXPECT:

Snow days cause an inconvenience for all of us. Closing schools is a difficult decision for the school district – trying to weigh the safety of everyone, with the repercussions for working families. To help assist families, we would like to outline what you can expect from us on a snow day. The following things will happen:

Schools will be OPEN unless conditions reach unsafe or emergency proportions. **Radio announcements will only announce those schools that are CLOSED.** Most of these schools will be private schools. Listen to radio: CBC 690AM; CKNW 980AM; NEWS 1130AM; QM 103.5FM or watch on television: CBC; Global; CTV; CityTV.

As well, you can get information other ways:
