

Summer Learning 2022

Summer 2022 is shaping up to be another exciting season of learning! There will be many courses and camps to choose from.

- Students who enroll in Elementary Enrichment, Exploration, Fine Arts or Innovation may take only ONE COURSE.
- Students who enroll in Academic Full Credit, Academic Completion or Secondary Enrichment may take in ONE or MORE courses.
- All international students with valid BC Study Permits will be charged tuition fees and may take one or more courses.
- Students may enroll in ONE or MORE fee paying summer camps.
- MORE DETAILS WILL BE AVAILABLE IN MID-APRIL.

At this time, most Summer Learning 2022 courses and camps will be taught in-person, with students attending all classes with health and safety protocols in place. If conditions change, the delivery model may need to be adapted.



ELEMENTARY ENRICHMENT (Grade 1-7, non-credit)

These non-credit BC Ministry of Education courses include Core Competencies, Big Ideas and Curricular Competencies along with Aboriginal perspectives and knowledge. These courses will NOT cover the entire scope of a full course. Students will review or get ready for September through learner-centered and engaging activities. This program is funded through the BC Ministry of Education: English Language Arts, ELL (Beginners ELL 1 & 2), French, Math-Science & Music.

ADOLESCENT MENTAL HEALTH & WELLNESS

Richmond parents and our community are invited to a free discussion and presentation with internationally renowned experts in adolescent mental health Andrew Baxter, Dr. Li Sha and Dr. Yifeng Wei.



ANDREW BAXTER

Andrew Baxter, MSW RSW, has worked in school-based and community mental health for over 18 years. During his time with Alberta Health Services, he has provided direct treatment for students from K-12, as well as consultation for their families and teachers. Andrew currently serves as the Team Lead for mentalhealthilteracy org and the Alberta Mental Health Literacy Project. In these roles, he has worked to promote school mental health literacy among students, educators, parents, and mental health professionals at provincial, national and international levels.





DR. LI SHA

Dr. U Sha, MEd, PhD, is currently the research coordinator of the Mental Health Literacy project in SD 38, and has worked as an instructor at the Trinity Western University since 2020. In recent years he has provided educational consulting services for local Chinese families. Dr. Sha worked as researcher in educational psychology in Canada, Hong Kong, Singapore, and the US. His research focuses on studying K-12 students' learning and motivation. Dr. Sha is a member of American Psychological Association (APA).

DR. YIFENG WEI

Dr. Yifeng Wei, MA, PhD, has worked as a researcher and school mental health lead with mentalhealthliteracy.org since 2008. She is currently assistant professor with the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Alberta. Her research interests focus on promoting mental health literacy in schools (both secondary and post-secondary settings) to help students gain better understanding about mental health and mental disorders, reduce stigma against mental illness, obtain and maintain good mental health and enhance help-seeking behaviors.

TCO2 Presentation on April 27 for Divisions 1, 2 and 3



Over the next two weeks, starting this Thursday, April 7th, The Children of the Street Society will be presenting virtually to our intermediate students about online safety and protecting themselves from sexual exploitation through a workshop called *"Taking Care of Ourselves, Taking Care of Others (TCO²)"*. There are two grade appropriate, 50 minute presentations - one for the Grade 4/5's and one for the Grade 6/7's. The Children of the Street Society is a provincial organization and federal charity dedicated to preventing the sexual exploitation of children and

youth in British Columbia. They have created public awareness through educational strategies and supported families since 1995. Their programs and staff have been recognized for numerous achievements and awards.

The presentation focuses on:

- healthy vs. unhealthy relationships
- exploiter and exploitation
- · warning signs and scenarios that could be dangerous both in-person and online
- what consent is
- online safety tips when using apps or playing video games
- safe adults and ways to reach out for help
- local resources available

This topic is a current reality for our students and it is important for our youth to be aware of the issues and have the skills to protect themselves. We are fortunate to have this valuable resource come to all our schools.
