National Indigenous Heritage Month

June is National Indigenous History Month in Canada--an opportunity to learn about the unique cultures, traditions and experiences of First Nations, Inuit and Métis. It's a time to honour the stories, achievements and resilience of Indigenous Peoples, who have lived on this land since time immemorial and whose presence continues to impact the evolving Canada.

The House of Commons designated June as National Aboriginal History Month in 2009. The name was changed to National Indigenous Heritage Month in 2017.

Please see the poster recognizing National Indigenous History Month and the significance of the visuals. The 3 illustrations represent Indigenous peoples: an eagle representing First Nations, a narwhal representing Inuit, and a violin representing Métis. These illustrations are placed around the sun and surrounded by multicoloured smoke that represents Indigenous traditions, spirituality, inclusion and diversity.



2. Treasurer:

Book-keeping/accounting experience is recommended.

Keeps financial records and renders financial statements to the Officers, Members, and others when required; acts as a signing officer, assists the Executive to prepare a budget and tentative plan of expenditures for the Council.

3. Secretary

Records the minutes of the meetings of the Members and Executive; issues and receives correspondence on behalf of the organization; has custody of all records and documents of the Council.

NOTICE OF LATE RETURN 2023-2024

The attached form with this latest update must be completed for any student(s) who anticipate a delayed return to school in September and will not be in attendance by 12:00pm on Wednesday, September 6, 2023. Please return the form to the school principal by June 23, 2023.

Please note that student absences at the start of the school year result in missed opportunities for valuable social connections, instructional time, and establishment of routines and expectations. The reason for a late return to school should only be for extenuating circumstances.

Please be advised that any student not in attendance before end of the school day on September 14, 2023, will not be guaranteed a placement at Kingswood Elementary School. This may result in a placement at another school upon return.

In the event of an unforeseen critical family circumstance occurring after July 1, 2023, that causes an unexpected late return to the school, the parent must advise the school as soon as possible by email (kingswoodesd38.bc.ca).
