As a school and district, we are dedicated to fostering an inclusive and compassionate environment for all our students, families, and staff. As we approach September 30, the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation, we wanted to share with you a few important events that are taking place in our school and district.

On September 22, 2023, our entire district staff engaged in a day of learning about Indigenous History, First Peoples Principles of Learning, and our collective role in reconciliation.

Additionally, in honour of the children lost and the generations impacted by residential schools, we will be displaying the orange "Every Child Matters" flag in our school. We are fortunate to have been gifted this flag through the fundraising efforts of the Student Social Justice Committee at Hugh Boyd Secondary. This student led committee worked hard to raise funds to provide each school in our district with an "Every Child Matters" flag as part of their action towards Truth and Reconciliation. The flag serves as a collective dedication to learning, understanding, healing and reconciliation.

Finally, a reminder that the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation occurs each year on September 30th. As this occurs on Saturday this year, the statutory day will be on Monday, October 2, 2023, and therefore school will not be in session on this day.

Orange Shirt Day

FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2023

In addition to displaying the Every Child Matters flag in a place of prominence in our school this week, classes will also be engaged in learning more about Indigenous history, the origins of Orange Shirt Day, about the 94 Calls of Action, residential schools and the path towards reconciliation within their own classes, using resources and materials that are appropriate for the various grade levels.

We encourage all of Kingswood to wear orange on Friday, September 29. If your child does not have an orange shirt, or you cannot find one--not to worry as this week, all children will have the opportunity to create an Orange Shirt Day button to wear on this day. If you are still looking for an orange shirt for your child, however, please note that I have found them at London Drugs as well as at Winners in Lansdowne Mall. Another option is Michaels on Bridgeport Road--they have plain coloured shirts in several colours (I would suggest calling ahead to see if they have any orange shirts left in stock before traveling out there, however.)

On Orange Shirt Day, we will begin with an Orange Shirt Day assembly, followed by a circle of silence in the school field. Families are always welcome and encouraged to attend any of our assemblies.

Later in the day, our students will take wooden hearts that they have created with messages and illustrations and will affix them to the wooden fence outside of our

PAC Upcoming Events and How You Can Help!


It was amazing to see so many parents out helping in the morning for our Terry Fox Run cutting up oranges for the children!

The Richmond School District uses <u>School</u> <u>Cash Online</u>, an online fee payment system which allows parents to pay online for student school supplies, field trips and other school related items.

For safety and efficiency reasons, the school district has implemented this service to reduce the amount of cash and cheques coming into our schools.

1. Create Your Profile

Select the "Get Started Today" on the School Cash Online homepage:

Complete Step 1, click on "Continue"
Complete Step 2, click on "Continue"
Step 3 will be the screen below.



Be sure to select "Yes" to email notifications. Click on "Continue".

Note: your password must contain 8 characters, one uppercase letter, one lowercase letter and a number.

2. Confirm Your Email

Check your inbox for the confirmation email and click on the confirmation link in the email. Remember to check your spam inbox if you don't receive the email.

Sign in using the email and password you just provided.



3. Add a student

Add a student to your account by filling in the required information about your child.



Note: When adding a student, you will need your child's pupil number. The pupil number is on the top of the Student Verification form that comes home in September or call the school office for your child's number.

View Items or Add Another Student

If you have more children you would like to add, select "Add Another Student" and repeat the steps above. Once you have all desired students added, select "View Items for Students", which will list all available items or activities for purchase.

4. How <u>To</u> Make A Payment Sign In

Go to

https://richmondsd38.schoolcashonline.com and click "Sign <u>Into</u> Your Account". Fill in your email/username and password.

View Items

Select the item that you would like to purchase and click "Add to Cart".

Check Out

Once you have finished adding items to you cart, press "Check Out" to make payment

You can pay for multiple student's items in one Check Out.

Payment methods available:

1. Credit Card:

Mastercard or Visa are accepted.

2. eCheque:

An electronic version of a paper cheque used to make payments online. To pay with an eCheque, enter your information on the payment screen and click submit.

3. myWallet:

An online wallet that can be loaded to hold funds and pay for your child's fees on School Cash Online. If using myKallet, funds need to be added to myKallet, first and then the item needs to be selected and paid for. You have the option to load myKallet, up to \$200.00 at one time. This will allow you to allocate funds to pay for school fees at a later date, as you would with a gift card. Please note: It can take up to 7 days from the date the funds are loaded for funds to become available.
