NOTE TO PARENTS/GUARDIANS

Planning for the 2025/26 school year is underway. It is critical that school principals know the number of students who will be attending each school for September 2025 in order to allocate staff and resources for the upcoming year. To this end, parents/legal guardians are asked to complete the information section on the reverse side of this form and return it to the teacher of the oldest child in the school by **Friday, Jan 17th**. Students who arrive after this date should fill this form out and return it within 3 weeks of arrival.

Catchment Area Students:
Students who reside in the catchment area of a school and continue in the school each year.

Please complete **Parts One and Three** of this form and return it to the teacher of your oldest child by **Friday, January 17th**.

Non-Catchment Area Students:
Students who attend non-catchment schools. These are students who:

- May have moved out of the catchment area of the current school but decided to stay at the current school. Students have the right to continue to study at the current school, even after moving.
- Students who may have been accepted transfers into the non-catchment current school.
- Students who have been placed by the district at current non-catchment schools because there was no room at the catchment schools.

Non-catchment students may lose their status as continuing students if they do not inform their non-catchment schools of their **intent to attend** for September.

Please complete **Parts One and Two** of the form, and return it to the teacher of your oldest child by **Friday, January 17th**.

Please complete the reverse side and return it to the teacher of the oldest child in the school by **Fri January 17th, 2025.**

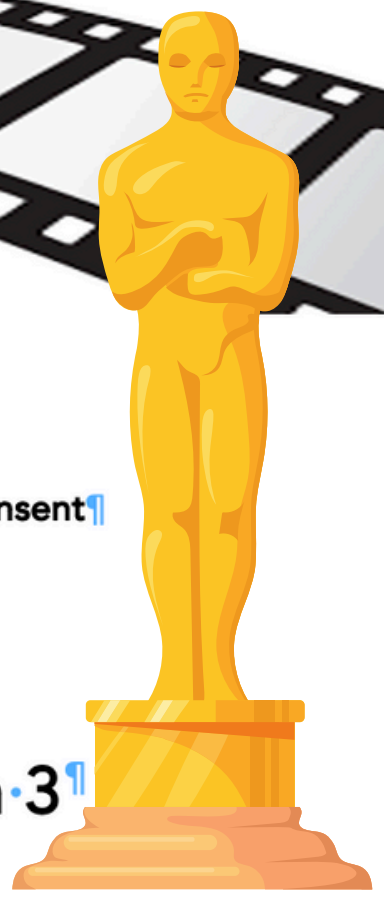


Kingswood Oscars

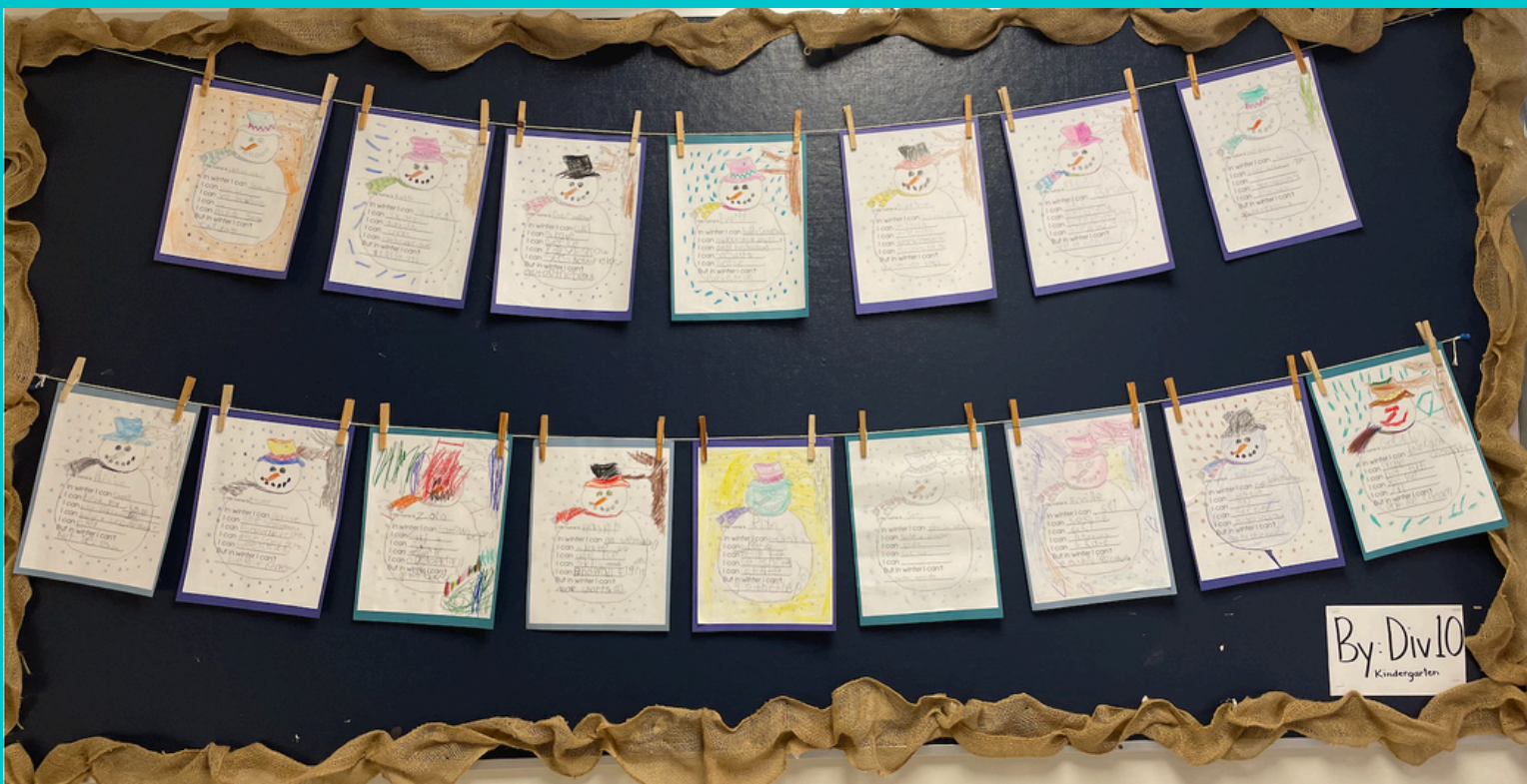
