May 23	Anti-racism	Anniversary of Komagata Maru  On May 23, 1914, the Komagata Maru steamship arrived in Vancouver's Burrard Inlet. On board were 376 Sikhs, Muslims, and Hindus of South Asian origin and were denied entry into Canada based on racist laws.
May 23	Faith-Based Buddhism Hinduism Cultural	Vesak/Wesak/Buddha Day/Visakha Puja The most sacred holy day of Theravada Buddhism. Vesak is an observation of the birth, enlightenment, and death (parinirvana) of the historical Buddha.
